Gujarat Kenville Challenge

The third edition of the Gujarat Kenville Challenge was comprehensively won by Shiv Kapur by two shots, shooting 1 under in the final round for a total of record 14 under, to edge past Andrew McArthur (12 -under) and four time challenge tour winner Philip Archer finishing third at 11 -under. Shiv Kapur shot a course record 7 under par on day three to be in the leader group with a four shot lead. His four shot lead was in danger when he bogeyed the first two holes. But he came back strongly he was back with back to back birdies on the 4th and 5th. After this he was never in danger even after McArthur went on a birdie spree on 15th, 16th and 17th. Rich Beem shot a 5-under best card of the day, on the last day to finish in top 15.



Golf tip of the month.

8 lessons series contd.. Lesson 3

Ball Position

The ball placement varies with the club you select. From a flat lie:

Play your short irons (wedges, 9-iron and 8-iron) in the center portion of your stance. These clubs have the most upright lie angles and they must be swung at the steepest angle, and you should take a divot in front of the ball.

Your middle irons should be played one ball toward the target-side foot from center (a ball left of center for the right-handed golfer). These clubs have a slightly flatter lie angle and you should take a slightly shallower divot than with the short irons.

The correct ball position for the long irons and fairway woods is two balls toward the target-side foot from center (two balls left for the right-hander). With these clubs, the ball should be struck directly at the bottom of the swing arc with very little divot.

The driver is played farthest forward (three balls left of center for the right-hander) to strike the ball on the upswing.



Rule of the Month

Rule 17 – Flagstick

- 17-1 – Players may authorize another player or caddy to attend (stand within reach of), remove, and/or hold up the flagstick before making a stroke. Various notes define particular nuances; a significant one is that any player within reach of the flagstick is attending it, and if the player notices and does not object, they have authorized it by default.
- 17-2 – Attending, removing or holding up the flagstick must not be done during the stroke or while the ball is in motion if the player has not authorized it, and a player or caddy who does so incurs a penalty.
- 17-3 – Players incur a two-stroke penalty for hitting the flagstick or the attendant with the ball in certain circumstances:
- When the flagstick is attended, removed, or held up with authorization. If the attendant fails to remove the flagstick, or does not move from the line of putt thus causing the ball to strike them, even if the player had wished them to do so, the player still incurs the penalty. However, if an opponent or fellow-competitor attends the flagstick in the hole and fails to remove it for the purpose of making the player incur the penalty, the opponent incurs a two-stroke penalty under Rule 1-2 and may be disqualified for a serious breach of that rule.
- When the flagstick is unattended in the hole, and the player's last stroke was a putt from on the green. The flagstick must be removed from the hole when putting to remove a potential advantage to the player of having the flagstick stop the ball from rolling over the top of the hole.
- 17-4 – If the flagstick is in the hole and a player's ball comes to rest against it, and when the flagstick is removed the ball falls in, the player has holed out.
