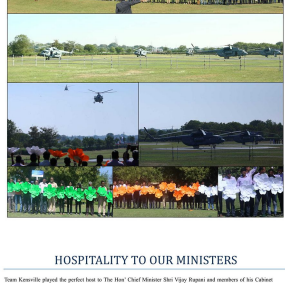




KENSVILLE WELCOMES THE PRIME MINISTERS

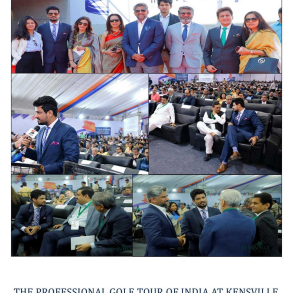
INAUGURATION EVENT

THE PROFESSIONAL GOLF TOUR OF INDIA AT KENSVILLE

Wasim Khan wins the PGTI Qualifying School 2018. Thirty-eight players earn full cards for 2018 season. Kensville Golf & Country Club, Ahmedabad, January 20, 2018.
 The Professional Golf Tour of India, held their annual Qualifying School Tournament at Kensville for the 3rd year in a row. It is a matter of great pride for Kensville to be able to play host to this very important event in the life of a professional golfer. Over 300 Professional golfers played over a 1800 rounds of golf in the 18-day period, which is a record in itself. The team at Kensville thanks its members and patrons for bearing with the tournament and yielding their playing time at the course to the Professionals. Delhi's Wasim Khan (74-71-71-75) won the PGTI's Final Qualifying Stage for the 2018 season being held at the Kensville Golf & Country Club. Wasim's final round of one-over-73 saw him end up with a tournament tally of one-over-289, which helped him post a one-shot victory. Australia's Kanak Bhasin (75-67-75-73) finished second at two-over-290 after he too shot a final round of 75. At the end of round four, the top 18 players earned their cards for the 2018 PGTI season as the cut in the final round went at 13-over-291. Wasim said, "The key to my success this week was the fact that I just enjoyed myself out there. Today, I didn't really go for the pins but played regulation golf. It was a plan that had worked for me over the first three days as well. Indian golfing legend Ganan Ghoti of Delhi secured sixth place at five-over-293. The two other amateurs who finished inside the top-10 were Kolkata's Sanit Chatterjee and Chennai's Shivramen Srinivasan. The duo ended the week in tied seventh at six-over-294 along with Vijay Kumar, Rajesh Kumar Rawat and Sahil Kulkarni.
