Title was Rahil Gangjee's to take, but Maximilian Kieffer held on to his nerve to win Gujarat Kensville Challenge

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espite some twists in the tale, the ending remained the same for Rahil Gangjee as Maximilian Kieffer edged him out in the playoffs to win the Gujarat Kensville Challenge 2012 on Sunday.

"It went both ways. At one point I thought it was mine," Gangjee later said at the Kensville Golf and Country Club.

DRAMA UNFOLDED

The drama unfolded in the eighth hole where Gangjee suffered a bogey. Playing in the leadergroup, Kieffer, who started a shot behind, fell further behind with a bogev in the fifth. But the 21-year-old surged ahead with birdies in the 6th, 7th and 9th hole.

The Indian pro then lifted the home hopes with 10th, 12th, 13th and 14th, while his German group mate suffered bogevs in 10th and 13th. From greenkeepers to 'golf experts', the verdict was written - in the land of his ancestors, Gangiee will break his title draught.

GAME-CHANGER

However, destiny had different plans. Gangjee's old frailty appeared again when he bogeved 15th and 16th holes and saw his rival scoring birdies in 14th and 16th. "16th hole was the turning point of the game," Kieffer declared. "The 16th was the game changer. It's difficult to be aggressive

after that," Gangjee added. It was all over when Gangjee found his second shot, in the playoff, into the water hazard. "I was desperate to put it right but I did not have a good stance. It was just bad luck as I hit the lip and the ball went into the water," he said after the shot that ended it all.

NO REGRETS

Taking the time back to 2010 when he lost on the final day of the Avantha Masters, there was a different side of him to see. While at Avantha Masters, Gangjee kept it to himself but at the Kensville Golf and Country Club, he surprised the ones who knew him as he mingled with the crowd, signing autographs and posing for pictures after his loss. His positive attitude despite the loss was refreshing.

"I played solid but I also played some bad shots. However, I have no regrets about

the decisions that I made this week." Gangiee said.

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

With Gangjee's impressive beginning at the start of the back nine, a victory was not in Kieffer's mind. But as he said, "Expect the unexpected and so I always keep trying."

His attitude paid off after the birdie in the 16th hole that levelled the scores and pushed for a playoff. Rest, as they say, is history. "Of course, there were a few nerves on the inside, but I was delighted with how I coped mentally," said the golfer who won his maiden European Challenge Tour title.

Incidentally, Kieffer was supposed to come to India two years ago for the Bonallack Cup - an amateur event between Europe and Asia-Pacific teams. However, the young German made his maiden Indian tour a memorable one.
